Footpath - Golden Fleece Letter from the owners stated that their records do not indicate that it is their responsibility. Letter from the Chief Execut: of the County Council stated that the path had not been 'adopted' but that a sensible solution would be for the County Council to take it over. Prop. Coun. Palliser, sec. Coun. Kirk 'that the County Council take over the path.' Agreed.

Pootpath to Zebra Crossing Letter from Technical Officer H.D.C. stated that he did not consider any remedial work necessary at the present time. Prop. Coun. Palliser, sec. Coun. Kirk 'that the H.D.C. be asked to grout the area
